We are finalizing our plans so we can submit our budget request to the budget committee. Please pray that we will hear The Lord's voice to fulfill His mission calling here at Faith Baptist for the coming year. Until the Last One has heard the gospel, let us be diligent in our calling.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

Praising God for his wisdom and direction, the leadership committee has reviewed and suggested a plan for both remodeling and adding to the existing building. The plan showing all construction is available for everyone to look at in the front foyer. Please look at what we feel is the direction the Lord is leading us into the future. This plan will hopefully equip us to satisfy our current congregation and also allow us to meet the needs of others looking for a small neighborly Bible believing, God driven church. What is next? PRAYER BY ALL OF US. We will have a vote to accept this plan, then the architect will put together plans showing electrical, plumbing, and air conditioning, as well as both interior and exterior finishes. These plans will then go out for bid to the different trades in hopes to have a minimum of three bids for all work. After pricing is returned and approved we will submit for permits from Rockledge. Estimated time frame: plans approved by congregation by September, architect finalize drawings, church approves end of October, drawings out for bid, with bids returned reviewed and approved by the church mid December. Drawings submitted to Rockledge for approval with prayers they are approved by February of 2026, with a start date of March 2026. My estimated time would be that we are looking at praying for a completed project in the fall of 2026. Review what we are looking to accomplish: the following are significant changes; completely changing the sanctuary turning it 180 degrees, adding a new entrance with a porta-cohere on the side of the existing building, moving the kitchen and bathrooms to the existing group gathering room, and adding many new bathrooms for all. A new addition going out the rear of the building giving us room for expansion of our existing sanctuary and at the same time giving us the room needed for Sunday school rooms and special events. Please be excited and in prayer. In closing, while this will be an expensive endeavor the church has already raised most of the money needed and we need to trust in God to provide thru the generosity of those who will get to enjoy the end results of this project.
